



## ***Eligible Grants for Home Improvements/Retrofits***

Install an earth-energy system (ground or water source) that is CAN/CSA-C448 compliant and certified by the Canadian GeoExchange Coalition (CGC). Applies to new or complete replacement. (See [www.geo-exchange.ca](http://www.geo-exchange.ca))\*

***Combined Grant = \$7875.00 (Federal Grant of \$4375 & Provincial Grant of \$3500)***

\* Provincial grant of \$3500 applies if you are replacing an existing wood, electrical, oil or propane primary heating system. To be eligible for the grant, if replacing a natural gas heating system, the electricity to run the system must be generated on-site using a renewable resource. This criteria takes into consideration economics and the impact on the environment in Saskatchewan.

## ***Energy Efficient Rebate for New Homes***

Install a CAN/CSA-C448 compliant Geothermal System. \*\*

***Available Grant = \$3500.00***

\*\*The Geothermal rebate, funded by SaskPower, is effective for homeowners who took possession of their new home on or after January 1, 2008. In order to qualify for the rebate you must meet all of the following criteria:

1. Geothermal systems must be CAN/CSA-C448 compliant and certified by the Canadian GeoExchange Coalition (CGC). Please submit a copy of the CGC Certificate with your application.
2. There is no access to natural gas. If a home does have access to natural gas, in order to be eligible for the Geothermal rebate the homeowner must install an onsite renewable energy source large enough to offset the estimated increased electrical load and have a net metering system installed (or not be connected to the electrical grid). Ex. wind or solar
